Base on the amount of equipment, field space, and number of coaches it will be necessary for us to conduct a tryout process. Unfortunately not all of you will make the team. Please do not take this personally. If you do not make the team it just means there are some areas of improvement that you must work on and we encourage you to try out again next year.

Attendance

Attendance at all men's lacrosse functions is mandatory. An absence is only excused by a parent or doctor's note that identifies the reasons the player cannot attend. This must be done prior to the absence. An injury does not preclude you from attending lacrosse related activities. If you are injured you are still expected to attend practices and games. Unexcused absences result in the following penalties:
