With approximately \$1.4 trillion of outstanding debt, student loans are now the second-largest category of household debt in the U.S., trailing only home loans.

Over the past 20 years, college costs have grown at over three times the rate of inflation. The result: 70% of college graduates have student debt, with the average borrower owing more than \$37,000 at graduation.

Frequently Asked Questions:

Would I apply to colleges/universities as a Freshman or a Transfer?

You will apply as a Freshman to most colleges, even though you have 60 credits/Associates degree, you are eligible for scholarships and Financial Aid. You will be eligible for freshman student housing and scholarships.

Is there a test to be considered for the LTHS-OCC College Academy?

Students transcripts are audited and a meeting with your counselor to determine the best and most appropriate pathway for you to pursue in your Junior year. LTHS requires that you sit for the Accuplacer test.

How does this affect the NJ Stars Program?

Students are eligible for Tier 2, but not Tier 1.



New Jersey - Lampitt Law (Transfer Law)

New Jersey has a state-wide agreement to assist students with transfer from a community college to a 4-year public institution. Under the <u>Lampitt Law</u>, community college students who complete an AA or AS degree will receive credit for all courses successfully completed towards their bachelors degree.

- The law only covers students who graduate with a two year degree from a New Jersey county college.
- The law does not guarantee acceptance to college. Students must still apply and be granted admission, which can be competitive and require specific coursework and/or GPA (e.g. business, teaching, and engineering, among other programs).
- Ultimately, the acceptance and application of credits is determined by the receiving institution of higher learning.
