





This story is about Nicola Sacco and Bartolomeo Vanzetti, Italian immigrants who were charged with killing a paymaster and security guard in South Braintree, MA, in April 1920. Both immigrants were laborers who had become disillusioned with the United States because they had not achieved the American Dream. As a result, they involved themselves in the anarchist movement. Anarchists are extreme left wingers and intend to end nation-states, governments and capitalism, systems they believe that create hierarchies in society. Following World War I, a Red Scare swept the United States. Communists and other leftwing political extremists planted bombs in public and at private homes to intimidate the wealthy and political classes. The fear was real. The US Attorney General, A. Mitchell Palmer used extreme, unlawful measures to apprehend these domestic terrorists. He became so popular that he was considered a contender for the presidency. This is the backdrop of the story of Sacco and Vanzetti. Because they lied to police for fear of being punished for their anarchist political activities, they were charged with the South Braintree murders. The authors describe Sacco and Vanzetti's unfair trial which included unreliable witnesses for the prosecution, the public outcry of support for the defendants, and the eventual executions of both men. This historical fiction book written well by Carolyn Tara O'Neil gives a new twist on Anastasia Romanov's surviving of the brutal murder of her royal family by the crude Bolshevik revolutionaries. This book gave a great view from Anya & her new friend Evgenia who were on different sides of the revolution but also from different economic classes. Anya learned what it was really like to be a peasant in Russia during the war while Evgenia learned how not all people she meets from the support of the tsar side are terrible people. 


Made of Stars



Hanged! Mary Surratt & The Plot to Assassinate Abraham Lincoln

A dubious distinction belongs to Mary Surratt: on July 7, 1865, she became the first woman to be executed by the United States government, accused of conspiring in the plot to assassinate not only President Abraham Lincoln, but also the vice president, the secretary of state, and General Grant. Mary Surratt was a widow, a Catholic, a businesswoman, a slave owner, a Union resident, and the mother of a Confederate Secret Service courier. As the proprietor of the boarding house where John Wilkes Booth and his allies are known to have gathered, Mary Surratt was widely believed, as President Andrew Johnson famously put it, to have "kept the nest that hatched the egg." But did Mrs. Surratt truly commit treason by aiding and abetting Booth in his plot to murder the president? Or was she the victim of a spectacularly cruel coincidence? Grades 9-12, History







An Improbable Season By: Rosalyn Eves
