Ms. Amos and Dr. Dowd continued the discussion of the replacement of outdated materials that need to be budgeted for in the 25-26 budget cycle. This includes K-8 ELA replacement materials and high school Mathematics materials.

#### **Special Education**

Ms. Amos highlighted the need to continue to look for a replacement reading program for learners that have not achieved the reading benchmarks with their peers. This is largely a Special Education program however some regular education learners will need to enter a reading intervention program as well.

#### **Technology**

• Developing a list of District-Approved AI tools for instructional/student use.

Dr. Dowd spoke of the work that his committee is doing to develop an Artificial Intelligence Policy for the district to include a list of AI tools that will be for approved use by the district.

### **Community Relations**

• Rotary visit on 3/11/25 to provide an update on the \$30,000 donation being utilized by the High School and Middle School.

Mr. Zylinski talked about the update on the "Building Men" program at the middle school that involves about 60 young men every month and the "All In" program at the high school that involves about 15 young women twice a month. Both programs are geared to provide the participants with social skills among other things to aid in their young development as adults.
