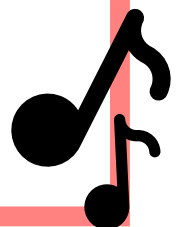


Peer Leaders

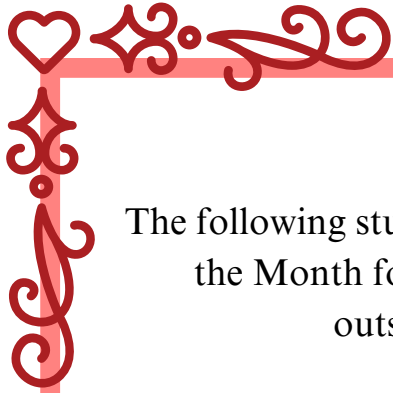
