

Advanced Placement

- AP Classes are endorsed by the College Board.
- They seek to prepare students for the AP test in a specific subject area.
- Students who receive a score of 3, 4, or 5 on an AP test may receive college credit depending upon their college's determination.

LTHS College Academy

- Ocean County College and LTHS have created a program where students can earn an associate degree through OCC before they finish high school.
- Students obtain 60 college credits
